

### Age Breakdown of Total Enrollment




### SCHIP Breakdown of Total Enrollment

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#### Oklahoma Hosts National Medicaid Meeting

OKLAHOMA CITY – Issues facing Medicaid programs nationwide were discussed this week as the Oklahoma Health Care Authority hosted the spring meeting of the National Association of State Medicaid Directors.

Representatives from 41 states, the District of Columbia and three territories, Saipan, Guam and the Virgin Islands, gathered this week in downtown Oklahoma City to discuss issues such as targeted case management, program integrity and health care reform.

“As the incoming NASMD Chair, I was thrilled to start my term in your state. Your state’s Medicaid program stands as a great example of the possibilities that exist for all of us to better serve our state’s most vulnerable population,” said Carol Steckel, NASMD Executive Committee Chair and Commissioner of the Alabama Medicaid Agency.

NASMD holds two national meetings each year, the spring meeting that is held in different states each year and a fall meeting that is held in Washington, D.C.

“We were very proud when Oklahoma was chosen to host this meeting. In addition to having the opportunity to network and share information with other states, we were given the opportunity to show off our great city and state,” said Mike Fogarty, CEO of the health care authority.

Oklahoma’s Medicaid Director Lynn Mitchell, M.D., serves as a member of the NASMD Executive Committee. The association consists of representatives of state Medicaid agencies, including the District of Columbia and the territories. It serves as a focal point of communication between the states and the federal government, and provides an information network among the states on Medicaid issues.
